# Selecting QM Trend Chart Options

Website visitors see only state and national options; they do not see any individual nursing home data.

Nursing homes logged into their Campaign account will be able to view their own home's QM trend lines on graphs along with state and national trends.

Clicking on the 'Enlarge chart' link below any graph will give an expanded view of the QM trend chart with all data points displayed and allow the user access to more details and chart functionality.

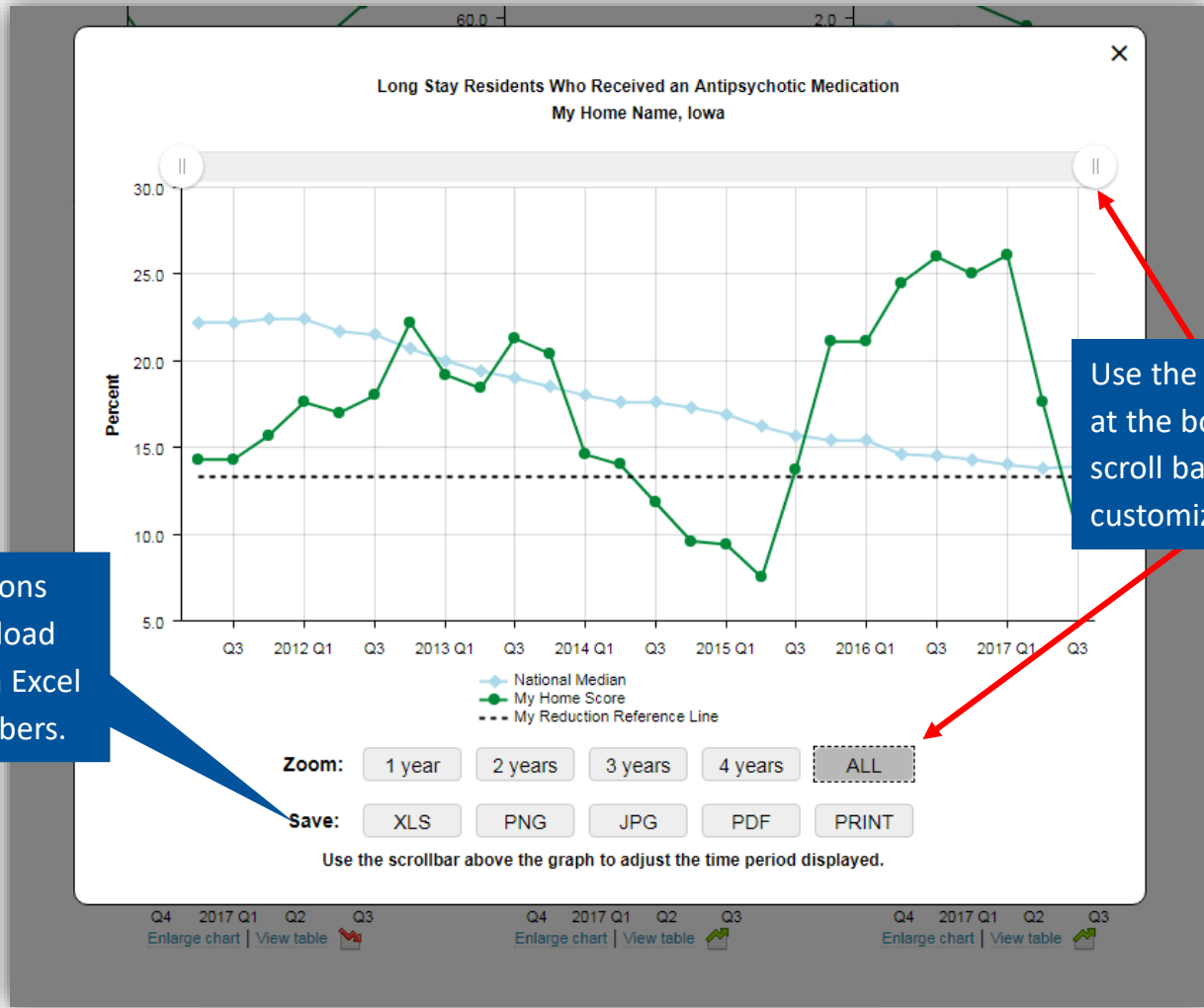
