Green Zone: No Signs of Infection	Green Means I Should:
 My heartbeat and breathing feel normal for me. I do not have fever, chills, or feel cold. My energy level is normal. My thinking is the same as usual. My access site or wound is free of pus, redness, swelling, or tenderness. 	 Watch every day for signs of infection. Continue to take my medicine as ordered, especially if I am recovering from an infection or illness. Attend all dialysis treatments and medical appointments. Follow access site care instructions. Wash my vascular access in the treatment room prior to every dialysis and wash hands frequently.
Yellow Zone: Caution	Yellow Means I Should:
 My heartbeat feels faster than usual. My breathing is fast, or I am coughing. I have a fever between 100.0°F and 101.4°F. I feel cold and am shivering—I cannot get warm. My thinking is different than usual—my head is "fuzzy." I do not feel well—I cannot do things I am usually able to do. It is painful when I urinate. My access site and/or any wound I have looks different. 	 Contact my doctor, especially if I have recently been ill or had surgery. Ask if I might have an infection or sepsis.  I feel sick, very tired, weak, and achy. My heartbeat or breathing is very fast. My temperature is 101.5°F or greater. My temperature is below 96.8°F. My fingernails are pale or blue. People say I am not making sense. 	 Act fast Sepsis is serious! Call 9-1-1 and say, "I need to be evaluated immediately. I am concerned about sepsis."

✓ My access site or wound is painful, red, swollen, or has pus.
