

Accessing Healthcare From a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)

What is an FQHC?

An FQHC is a federally-funded health center or clinic that provides care to individuals in a community who have limited resources.

How do I pay for care at an FQHC?

FQHCs were designed to provide care to individuals who do not have insurance or do not have enough insurance to pay for care. The cost of care is adjusted based on income and family size, called a sliding fee scale.

How can I find an FQHC near me?

You can locate FQHCs in your community at findahealthcenter.hrsa.gov. (Your transplant center can help you locate an FQHC to meet your needs.)

What kind of care is provided?



All FQHCs provide primary care. They may perform or refer for preventive services (e.g. mammogram, colonoscopies).



Many FQHCs also provide dental care and behavioral health services.



Some FQHCs also have on-site pharmacies to provide discounted prescription drugs.



FQHCs also can assist with transportation needs for patient appointments.
